
Spread of Christianity, to 11th Century

was introduced later.





The Byzantine Empire went from a major to a minor power in the century and a half portrayed on this map. After the Turkish defeat at Manzikert in 1071, the Byzantines maintained effective control over only a small fringe of Anatolia. In the Balkans, the new Serbian, Bulgarian, and Hungarian states were to become powerful, even though the Byzantines claimed control over the region.




SUCCESSION OF MUHAMMAD (RASHIDIN CALIPHS 632-661) (UMMAYAD CALIPHATE 661-750)

- 1st Caliph- Abu Bakr
 - Expanded Islam to present day Iraq & Syria
- Caliph- ‘Umar Ibn Khattab
 - killed by a slave
- Caliph- ‘Uthman
 - controversial Caliph





The Islamic conquests were rapid and far-reaching. By 750 Islamic monarchs controlled kingdoms stretching from central Asia to Spain.




Britain 400 – 500 Anglo-Saxon Homelands and Settlements
