




Her sights and sounds; dreams happy as her day;


And laughter, learnt of friends; and gentleness,


In hearts at peace, under an English heaven.

SECTION I.  
GENERAL PROVISIONS.


Article 231.

The Allied and Associated Governments confirm and Germany accepts the responsibility of Germany and her allies for causing all the loss and damage to which the Allied and Associated Governments and their nationals have been subjected as a consequence of the war imposed upon them by the aggression of Germany and her allies.


Article 232.

The Allied and Associated Governments recognize that the resources of Germany are not adequate, after taking into account permanent discriminations of such resources.

# The International Financial System Under the Dawes Plan and Young Plan 1924-30











The mushroom cloud from the Nagasaki atomic bombing, August 9, 1945.








Estimated deaths








Nighttime photograph taken from a satellite reveals the use of electricity in North America. The demand for electrical power even with most citizens in bed was enormous.




